1. Introduction

2. Aims of the SHA Library

The SHA Library (named the Sir Robert Ball Library) exists primarily as a resource for members of the Society for the History of Astronomy, but also as a reference library for members of the Birmingham and Midland Institute in which the library is housed. Managed and run by unpaid volunteers it is dedicated to helping SHA members in their research and to assisting them in increasing their knowledge of, and enjoyment in, the history of astronomy. Its acquisitions reflect members' interests, insofar as funds and donations allow. Members are encouraged to contact the library if there are specific items they feel the library should carry, or if they have items they are considering donating to the library for others to enjoy.

3. Location and access to collections

The Sir Robert Ball Library is located in the Benson Room which is on the lower ground floor of the Birmingham and Midland Institute (BMI), 9 Margaret Street, Birmingham, B3 3BS, England, (see: <http://www.bmi.org.uk/>). Located in the heart of the city of Birmingham, the BMI is less than a 10 minute walk from both Birmingham New Street and Snow Hill railway stations.

We aim to open the library at least one day per month (often two), and the coming opening dates are listed on the [website](#). There is no access to the SHA Library at other times and the library is securely double locked and alarmed. If you would like to come and use the library at a time other than the advertised opening dates then please do contact the library staff and we can try to accommodate this at a mutually convenient time: library@shastro.org.uk

There are toilets close to the library, and a lift between the floors of the building. A café on-site is open from 9am to 3pm, Monday to Friday and serves tea, coffee and a variety of sandwiches and light snacks.

There is no on-site car park, though paid on-street parking may be available in the surrounding streets, and there are several car parks within easy reach.

4. Services

The Library provides the following:

- Books, journals, miscellaneous publications and AV material.
- The services of SHA volunteer library staff, by arrangement (eg literature and online searches).
- Access to a computer, printer, scanner and the internet.
- Photocopying (A4, black & white).

5. Collections

The Sir Robert Ball Library currently comprises seven collections:

- **General Collection**; historic and modern books and AV items for reference only.
- **Reference Collection**; encyclopedias, dictionaries, etc for reference only.
- The **Stuart Williams Collection**; historic and modern books, including space exploration, for reference only.
- The **Alan Cox Memorial Collection** of Amateur Astronomy; historic and modern books on amateur astronomy.
- **Journals**; a major collection of historic and modern scholarly astronomical journals and magazines.
- The **Sir Patrick Moore Collection**; mainly modern books for lending to SHA members.
- **Miscellaneous**; reprints, leaflets and other miscellaneous items.

Recent bequests to the library from Gilbert Satterthwaite, Madeline Cox and Roger Jones have been incorporated into the main library stock. The origin of these books is both logged on the library database, and also inside the books themselves.

Work is still ongoing in the library to arrange the collections to make the most of the space available and to make access to them as user friendly as possible for visitors. As a temporary measure, all books are currently listed by shelf number, which is shown in this catalogue. If a book is removed from a shelf please ensure it is returned to that shelf or left for library staff to shelve.

6. Books for loan

Books in the Sir Patrick Moore Lending Collection are available for loan. Unfortunately it is not practicable to offer a postal loan service at present but this is under review.

7. Guidance on the use of material

Whilst it is expected that Members will take good care of all items whilst in their possession, they are requested to pay for any damage or loss incurred.

Care of materials. Many items in the Sir Robert Ball Library are old, delicate, valuable and in some cases irreplaceable. Therefore care needs to be taken when using them. There are cushions to rest books on when opening them. If a book has white tape around it, it is because the binding is worn so extra care is needed when handling this item.

As is common practice with archival material, **pencils only** should be used when making notes. You may use your own laptop and cameras, but there are only a limited number of power sockets in the library.

As is usual practice, eating and drinking is not permitted in the Sir Robert Ball Library.

Facilities. There is a laptop in the library running Windows 10 which is for members to use, a printer/scanner and a black & white A4 photocopier. There is a charge of 10p per A4 sheet for printing or photocopying in black & white.

There is free Wifi at the BMI for visitors.

8. Photocopying, scanning, photography and copyright

Subject to copyright restrictions and the physical condition and size of the items in question, visitors are permitted to photocopy, scan or photograph materials as they see fit, within reason.

Library staff are happy to copy a small number of pages for members who are unable to visit the library in person; the speed of this service will depend upon other commitments the library staff have, and the cost of copying and postage will fall on the member.

The lighting in the library is from fluorescent strip lights which are not ideal for photography. Flash photography is permitted.

Copyright rules apply regardless of the method used to make copies. These differ for non-commercial, private study ('fair dealing') and commercial use. In the latter case, the owner of the copyright should be contacted for permission to use the material, which may involve a fee.
